They will also be shared on the website going forward for parents who do not use Facebook.</p> <p>I appreciate that some parents do not like technology. We have tried in school to use a minimum of systems for parents to use. The main system is Parentmail which is used for school dinners, trips, communications and parents evening appointments so it is really important that parents are signed up to this. Paper copies can be requested and a note added to child's account on Arbor.</p>
<p><u>Comments when coming into school and accessing the school environment:</u></p> <p>No, school grounds are well designed/equipped</p> <p>School drop off/pick up is just horrendous, and don't feel there's anything that can be done about that in present state, planning when the school was built was clearly lacking in consideration of how many parents need to drive for drop off/pick up with little/no parking.</p> <p>Parking is not the best.</p> <p>Parking is a major issue with some parents/carers parking right in front of the gate to the point I have had to tell them myself you cannot park there eg: icy paths following snow fall at year</p>	<p>ZR</p>		<p>Parking has always been and continues to be an issue. We have asked on numerous occasions for parents to be respectful to our neighbours and mindful of where they park. We will keep sending out reminders on a regular basis.</p> <p>Like most schools we are situated in a residential area and permitted parking is very restricted.</p>

5 entrance the children could have slipped into the road as there is a slight slope and cars were parked right in front of the gate so the parents didn't have to get out of their cars.

Too many cars keep on coming in front of school Gate, sometimes, don't even give way to pedestrians
