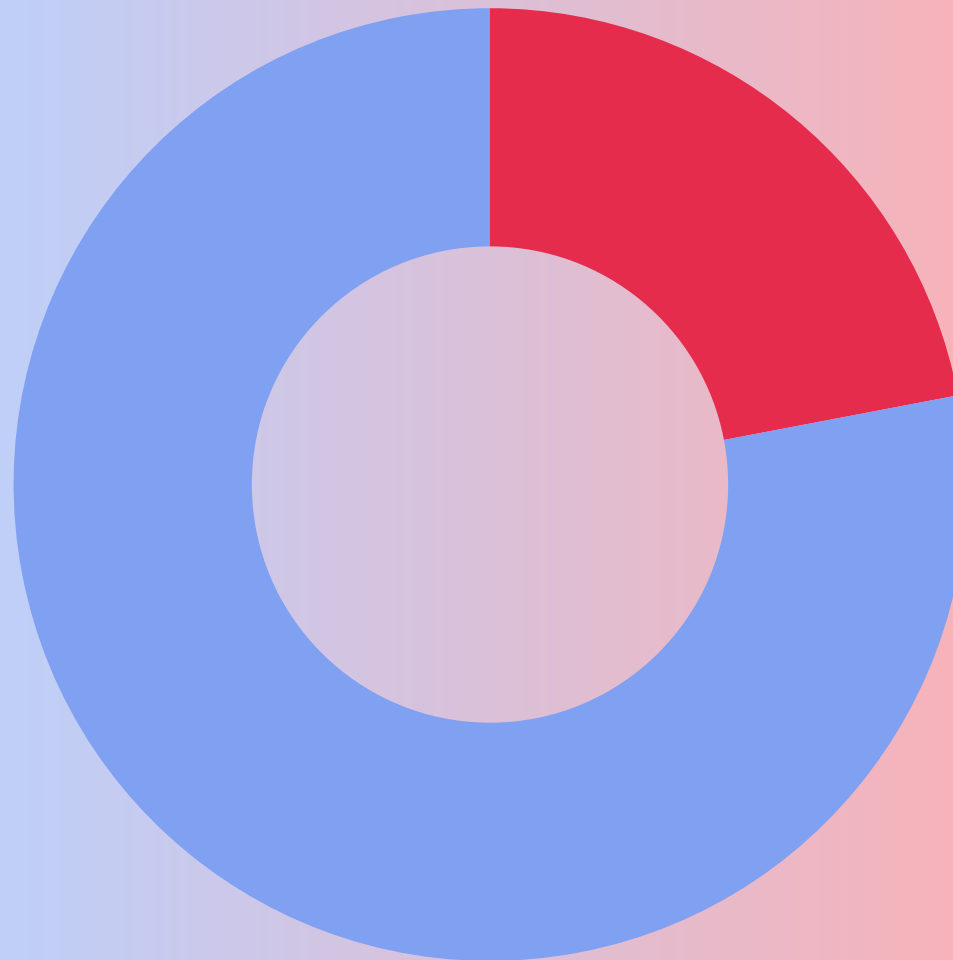

1 Why are we talking about this?

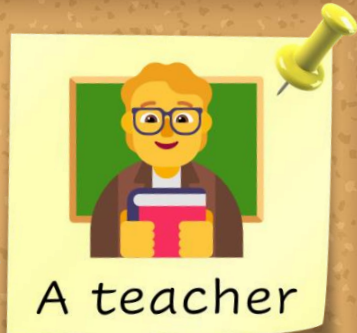

We should **practise kindness every week** by **sharing good thoughts** about our classmates. This will help us learn **how to be kind** and **to think good thoughts** about people.

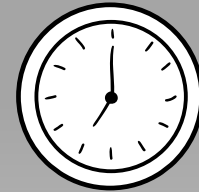

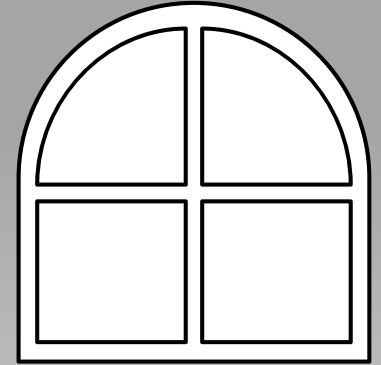
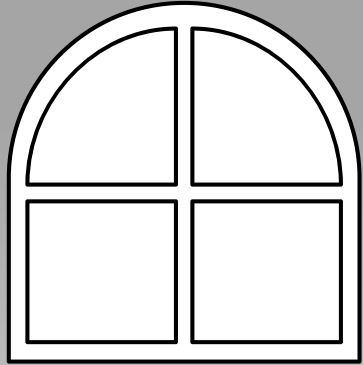


We should take part in **Anti-Bullying Week** once a year so that everyone spends a **week** thinking about how to deal with bullying.
