

Now you are going to hear some ideas from children which could help deal with bullying in schools. Talk to your partner and explain what you think of each idea using these sentence starters to help you.








We should practise kindness every week by sharing good thoughts about our classmates. This will help us learn how to be kind and to think good thoughts about people.




We should take part in Anti-Bullying Week once a year so that everyone spends a week thinking about how to deal with bullying.










Individual activity (1-2 mins) Now you are going to **vote** on which idea you think is **best for** dealing with bullying. Which idea was most popular?
