This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

All children have a one-hour music lesson each week. The curriculum is split up over the key stage to cover all aspects

The music curriculum is modelled using the guidance of the March 2021 model music curriculum using a variation on songs and music.

The school year is split into 3 terms and each term is split into 2 halves. The first half of each term curriculum music is taught and second half all children have instrument lessons.

All children learn to play a wide selection of untuned and tuned instruments and have access to tuned instruments throughout each key stage. Hand bells, chime bars, and glockenspiels

Second half of each term all children are taught an instrument

Year 1 and 2 Ocarina

Year 3 and 4 Recorder

Year 5 and 6 Ukulele

Instrument lessons have 3 different levels to achieve and certificates are available upon reaching each level

In school we have enough instruments for each child to have their own.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Year 3 are offered violin tuition in small groups

Year 4 are offered keyboard tuition in small groups

Choir is offered to years 3 and 4

Boy band is offered to year 6

All of these activities are offered to children free of charge taught by school music teacher.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Visits to local care homes with choir

Music extravaganza at Wolverhampton Civic with year 3 and 4 choir joining in with over 1000 children and live band

Take part in Wolverhampton Diversity Celebration.

All classes deliver a class assembly where music plays a part in it

Year 1 Singing round the tree to parents

Year 2 Christmas nativity to parents

Whole school Carol service at local church with various music groups taking part. Parents invited

Year 3 and 4 Easter production performed to school and parents

Year 6 End of year musical production

Summer term performance of Ocarina year 1 and 2 to whole school and parents Summer term performance of recorders year 3 and 4 to whole school and parents Summer term performance of ukulele and handbells year 5 and 6 to whole school and parents

Summer concert with Choir, boy band, violins and key board players to parents.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

Our aim is to at least take one-year group to see a live orchestra perform e.g. Symphony Hall Birmingham.

Our aim is also to offer more tuition in small groups and expand the number of violins and keyboards we have in school.
