Eary Years Curriculum

- Planning for each (WEEK/TERM) is carried out using a topic-based approach, following the children's interests and responding to specific events.
- Throughout the EYFS, children will be working towards the Early Learning Goals. These describe the level of attainment expected at the end of your child's Reception year in school.








Tapestry



- * At Lanesfield we use an online learning journey called "Tapestry" to record your child's "wow" moments throughout their time with us.
- This will form a unique record of your child's learning and development. It will contain photographs and staff observations. The photos are stored securely and you will be able to set up an account and access the observations once the term has begun.
- Messages are shared regularly through tapestry so we really encourage it's use.
- We believe a parent and school partnership is key. Tapestry is a wonderful opportunity for you to share your child's "wow" moments at home.




A Unique Learning Journey





A Day in Nursery...

- Children arrive- Find their name card on pegs and self register using our happy or sad trays. Toast available.
- Complete a daily calendar where we discuss the weather, sing our days of the week song and have a morning chat.
- Split into our key groups where we have a focus usually based upon our weekly text.
- Choosing time (indoors and outdoors)
- Snack time (fruit and milk provided)
- Story time/singing time
- Star of the day/home time







Lunch (Caterpillars)

- Lunch is provided, you will receive paperwork to help you logon to the website. Every meal is booked remotely by you, so we ask that you book your child's meal in advance and talk to them about their options.
- Alternatively your child can bring a healthy packed lunch to school.
- Lunch cover cost is £4 per day- Billed through parent mail
- Please ensure we have your 30 hour code or confirmation of renewal ASAP.





Uniform

- Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore
- White shirt or blouse
- Purple cardigan or school jumper
- School tie (Optional)
- Sensible black school shoes
- White or grey socks / tights

- Grey shorts

- Please ensure that all uniform and kit is clearly labelled with your child's name
- Wellies to be kept in school (labelled)
- It is a good idea to keep some spare clothes in your child's bag

How can I prepare my child?

Communication and early language are really important.

- sing nursery rhymes
- read books every day, especially bedtime stories
- count, both reciting and counting objects accurately
- play games eye spy, board games, card games, active games such as hide and seek
- Practise sharing their toys and talking in turns when playing games
- Practise making marks with pencils, pens, chalk and paint



How can I prepare my child?

A child who can look after themselves will be more confident at school. Here are our top tips:

- Practise going to the toilet, wiping their own bottom and flushing (the expectation is that your child is toilet trained before starting school) Practise washing their hands properly and for 20 seconds
- Practise blowing their nose and putting the tissue in the bin
- Practise fastening up their coats
- Feed themselves open packets, peel fruit and use a knife and fork
- Practise tidying up their own toys and helping with chores at home
