




As you grow, you learn about how to act in different places.

Whole class activity (3-5 mins) Now you will see some mystery objects that you might use in a shop. Can you guess what each object is before it is revealed?








## This is a **shopping basket**.

It is used to **carry things** around a shop before you **pay for them**.








#### This is a shopping trolley.

It can **carry** a lot of shopping.


You should try to **take them back to the shop** after using them.



















These are coins. You can use them to pay for your shopping.

Do you recognise any coins in this picture?











This is a **card machine**. Shop workers use it to **take payments** for people's shopping.




