


When people are growing up, they often think about who they are, or what they want to do when they are older.

Let's find out more about what a role model is...












A role model is someone that you might want to copy.

Mary is a goalkeeper who plays for Manchester United and for England. She received a special award for saving a goal in the World Cup final. She also has a business making clothes!


Business:

Selling things that you make, either to **people** or to **shops**.
















































Pair activity (6-8 mins)


Achieve:

Goals




Mya wants to be a scientist one day, but she finds reading tricky. Who can inspire her to achieve her dream?






Tommy wants to **make films** one day, but he **doesn't feel confident**. Who can **inspire** him to **achieve** his **dream**?
