A bank recently revealed that some **Taylor Swift fans** had been **scammed online.**

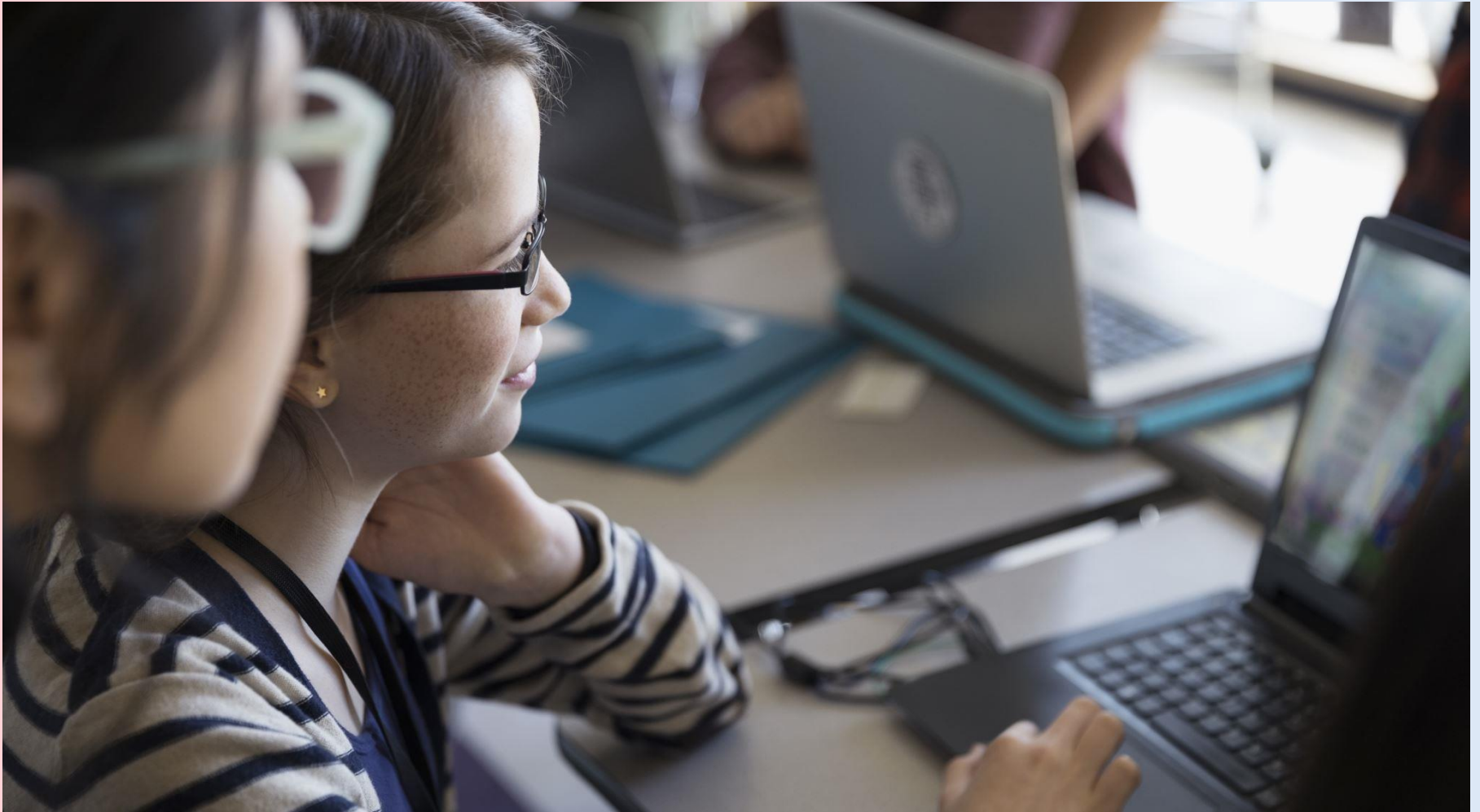
Lots of people **thought they had bought tickets to the Eras Tour**, but it turned out these **tickets didn't exist.**
